CORE VALUES:

Follow Jesus as the Model – because the way of Jesus and the work of Jesus go hand in hand

Jesus is not only the One who died on the cross for our sins, but also the One who lived a perfect human life of loving obedience to God the Father. He shows us not only what to live for, but how to live in intimacy with God, others in community, and service to the world as God's just and gracious kingdom is extended by the power of God's Spirit. We cannot truly do the work of Jesus without living his way and by the power of the same Spirit.

2 Be Guided by God's Word and Spirit – because becoming like Jesus is a journey of both Spirit and Truth

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb, I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made." – Psalm 139:13-14



Encouraging each other daily

We affirm that faith is not an "elective" whose expression is reserved for Sunday mornings, but a way of living every day and moment in growing trust in Jesus. Trusting in Jesus by definition includes community with others who also belong to him, and those relationships give encouragement, accountability and consistency in following Christ.

to follow Jesus

A follower of Jesus is someone who is entrusting his or her life to Jesus as Savior and Lord. Jesus, whose name means "The Lord Saves," saves us from our sins, from death, and from meaninglessness for a life of forgiveness, grace, peace and purpose that never ends. As we increasingly acknowledge Jesus' right to be in charge of our lives because of his redeeming life, death and resurrection, we progressively put all we are and have in his gracious hands. To follow Jesus is to learn as apprentices to his words, works, and way of life how to live as God intended.

and love the world.

Jesus came to restore all people to a loving relationship with God, (John 3:16), and we who follow him inherit his mission to love the world by extending his just and gracious rule, or kingdom, wherever we go.

We are a community of broken people learning to be loved by Jesus so that we can love like Jesus.

We are a community of broken people

God knows we are imperfect, flawed, broken people with no part of our lives untouched by the consequences of sinful attitudes and actions opposed to God's will for us. We gather together knowing that by ourselves no one is right with God, not even one (Romans 3:23). We also know that God created us good and in God's image, which is ultimately restored to wholeness through his Son, and God accepts us as right with God through what Jesus has done for us. So we have no basis for pride or pretence, and every reason to be humble and authentic before one another, because we are all received and become whole only by God's grace (Ephesians 2:8, Galatians 2:20-21).

learning to be loved by Jesus

In following Jesus, we learn to receive continually God's forgiveness and grace through him. We cannot truly live apart from the renewing, identity-changing power of his Spirit filling us to overflowing (John 4:14, 7:37-38). Apart from Jesus we can do nothing (John 15:5). All those practices that put us in a place to be renewed in our relationship with God as God's adopted, beloved children, to receive God's love directly and through others in community remind us of who we truly are. Being God's people comes before doing God's work. We cannot give or live out what we are not regularly receiving.

so that we can love like Jesus.

This is the mark of being followers or disciples of Jesus, that we love with the same tenderness, compassion, "toughness" and intensity with which Jesus loved his disciples and the world (John 15:12-13). We give our lives away to love, serve, and restore people and systems in the world to God. We extend the reach of God's just and gracious rule in the lives of people as we notice and join in what the Spirit is doing to make "your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10).
