

WORSHIP AT ST. ANDREW'S

Gathering for corporate worship is an integral part of our faith journey and a meaningful expression of our love for God. Knowing that different worship styles resonate with people's hearts in numerous ways, we purposely strive for a combined approach to worship. A combined style celebrates the strengths of each style rather than blending them into something less impactful. With that in mind, we craft each service with elements of both traditional and contemporary including music, various styles of prayer, and the use of videos.

On the first Sunday of the month, when we celebrate Communion, worship tends to be more traditional with our Chancel Choir while still including at least one contemporary element. Second and fourth Sundays are usually led by our worship team who loves to include well-known hymns in addition to new and powerful contemporary music. The third Sunday of the month is usually led by the St. Andrew's Strings sharing music from all musical genres and partnering with other music groups at St. Andrew's. Our prayer is that there is something in every worship service that inspires you and draws you closer to God.

From Pastor Jeff:

I wanted to share some great news with you on two fronts.

YEAR-END-GIVING

First, I have to admit you had me sweating the final weeks and days of the year on how St. Andrew's would end up financially, but your year-end efforts were worth the wait!

We ended the year ~ \$57,000 in the black for 2023, and this is despite being ~\$100,000 OVER budget on Facility maintenance costs! Take a moment to take that in. Although you can't see me, I'm jumping up and down shouting for joy at the top of my lungs!

FINANCES

We got to this great number because our Estimates of Giving were on budget and Non-estimated Contributions were about \$132,000 above estimates!

NAVIDAD MARKET

Secondly, our final tally for Navidad Market Missions Support 2023 was \$40,455.00! Another stellar result! Our mission partners are more grateful than you know for your generosity!

Giving

Gifts to the Operating Budget provide the resources needed to carry out our various ministry activities, pay our staff, and maintain our building. In addition, St. Andrew's takes missions very seriously. We "tithe" approximately 10% of our operating budget to support our external ministry partners both here in Houston and throughout the world. Such contributions also, either directly or indirectly, support the work of our branch ministries, such as the Children's Place Day School, Building Blocks, and the School of Fine Arts (SOFA).

St. Andrew's prefers for members who give regularly set up a recurring (e.g., weekly, monthly, quarterly) payment. This allows us to have a consistent source of funds even during the lean holiday and summer months when many of our members are out of town. We are a welcoming community of broken people - God knows we are imperfect, flawed, broken people with no part of our lives untouched by the consequences of sinful attitudes and actions opposed to God's will for us. We gather together knowing that by ourselves no one is right with God, not even one (Romans 3:23). We also know that God created us good and in God's image, which is ultimately restored to wholeness through his Son, and God accepts us as right with God through what Jesus has done for us. So we have no basis for pride or pretence, and every reason to be humble and authentic before one another, because we are all received and become whole only by God's grace (Ephesians 2:8, Galatians 2:20-21).

learning to be loved by Jesus - In following Jesus, we learn to receive continually God's forgiveness and grace through him. We cannot truly live apart from the renewing, identity changing power of his Spirit filling us to overflowing (John 4:14, 7:37-38). Apart from Jesus we can do nothing (John 15:5). All those practices that put us in a place to be renewed in our relationship with God as God's adopted, beloved children, to receive God's love directly and through others in community remind us of who we truly are. Being God's people comes before doing God's work. We cannot give or live out what we are not regularly receiving.

so that we can love like Jesus. - This is the mark of being followers or disciples of Jesus, that we love with the same tenderness, compassion, "toughness" and intensity with which Jesus loved his disciples and the world (John 15:12-13). We give our lives away to love, serve, and restore people and systems in the world to God. We extend the reach of God's just and gracious rule in the lives of people as we notice and join in what the Spirit is doing to make "your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10).


