SYMBOLS OF THE 12 APOSTLES



ST. PETER

The keys refer to the keys of Heaven, and the inverted cross refers to Peter's crucifixion.



ST. JOHN "THE BELOVED"

This symbol refers to the legend of a poisoned chalice offered to St. John in an attempt to end his life.



ST. JAMES THE GREATER

St. James was the first to go on a missionary journey. The scallop shells represent pilgrimage.



ST. ANDREW

According to tradition, St. Andrew was crucified on an X-shaped cross.



ST. JAMES THE LESSER

According to tradition, St. James was stoned and sawn by his attackers.



ST. MATTHEW

The moneybags refer to the occupation of St. Matthew before he was called by Christ.



ST. THOMAS

The ruler refers to the tradition that St. Thomas built a church by hand. The spear refers to his martyrdom.



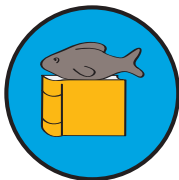
ST. JUDE

St. Jude (also known as Thaddeus) sailed to many ports as he journeyed as a missionary.



ST. BARTHOLOMEW

It is said that St. Bartholomew was flayed and crucified.



ST. SIMON

St. Simon, companions with St. Jude, was a fisherman by trade, but also known as a great fisher of men.



ST. PHILIP

Jesus directed St. Philip to feed His people, represented here by two circles of bread.



ST. MATTHIAS

St. Matthias was chosen to replace Judas Iscariot. The axe refers to his martyrdom.

WORSHIP AT ST. ANDREW'S

CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTIONS TO THE CANDIDATES

The moderator of Session shall ask those preparing to be ordained or installed to stand before the congregation and to answer the following questions:

Do you trust in Jesus Christ, your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

Will you be a faithful ruling elder or trustee, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

The elders- and trustees-elect, having answered in the affirmative, a ruling elder shall stand with them before the congregation and shall ask the congregation to answer the following questions:

Do we, the members of the church, accept these leaders as ruling elders or trustees, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ? DO WE?

Do we agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone in Head of the Church? DO WE?

WHO WE ARE

***We are a welcoming community of broken people,
learning to be loved by Jesus so we can love like Jesus.***

We are a welcoming community of broken people - God knows we are imperfect, flawed, broken people with no part of our lives untouched by the consequences of sinful attitudes and actions opposed to God's will for us. We gather together knowing that by ourselves no one is right with God, not even one (Romans 3:23). We also know that God created us good and in God's image, which is ultimately restored to wholeness through his Son, and God accepts us as right with God through what Jesus has done for us. So we have no basis for pride or pretence, and every reason to be humble and authentic before one another, because we are all received and become whole only by God's grace (Ephesians 2:8, Galatians 2:20-21).

learning to be loved by Jesus - In following Jesus, we learn to receive continually God's forgiveness and grace through him. We cannot truly live apart from the renewing, identity changing power of his Spirit filling us to overflowing (John 4:14, 7:37-38). Apart from Jesus we can do nothing (John 15:5). All those practices that put us in a place to be renewed in our relationship with God as God's adopted, beloved children, to receive God's love directly and through others in community remind us of who we truly are. Being God's people comes before doing God's work. We cannot give or live out what we are not regularly receiving.

so that we can love like Jesus. - This is the mark of being followers or disciples of Jesus, that we love with the same tenderness, compassion, "toughness" and intensity with which Jesus loved his disciples and the world (John 15:12-13). We give our lives away to love, serve, and restore people and systems in the world to God. We extend the reach of God's just and gracious rule in the lives of people as we notice and join in what the Spirit is doing to make "your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10).
